1 Introduction

NHS Workforce Alliance has put in place a framework agreement for the provision of occupational health, employee assistance programmes and eye care services for use by NHS organisations.

The aim is to provide access to a range of high-quality occupational health related services, in addition to eyecare services designed to meet the needs of the NHS that may cover, but will not be limited to full-service providers, occupational health services, individual services within occupational health (i.e. physiotherapy services, health screening services, counselling services, coaching services and vaccinations services), employee assistance programmes and eyecare services.

3 Who can access the framework

The full listing of entities who are able to utilise the agreement, subject to the approval of NHS Workforce Alliance is listed in Appendix A.

4 Accessing the framework

When a Contracting Authority has viewed the relevant framework documentation from NHS Workforce Alliance, those wishing to confirm access are required to complete the Framework/ Customer Access Agreement.

We would also request that a copy of the Call-off Order form or Purchase Order be sent to the organisation you have accessed the framework through. This will allow us to monitor usage of the framework and any documentation shared will be treated as commercial in confidence and will not be shared outside of the organisation.

5 Use of the Framework Agreement

Further Competitions

The award of a contract would follow the output of a further competition process between all capable suppliers under the framework agreement. In these circumstances the further competition would be used to establish the most economically advantageous tender in order to meet the specific requirements of the contracting authorities as laid down in the further competition documentation. It is envisaged a further competition process might be applied in the following circumstances:

- Where the specific requirements of the contracting authority are not sufficiently well defined within the specification of the framework agreement.
- Where an authority (or group of authorities) wanted to identify a single preferred solution to aid with collaboration activities. In such circumstances it is envisaged that improved commercial terms might be offered by bidding suppliers as part of the further competition process reflecting the enhanced commitment that was being made by an authority (or group of authorities) to a single preferred supplier for a period of time.

Each further competition invitation to tender process would reflect the precise nature of a contracting authority's local requirement, albeit in accordance with the permitted scope of service as outlined within the over-arching framework agreement.

Award criteria for further competitions under the framework agreement

When using this agreement to undertake further competition processes under the framework agreement, Participating Authorities may adjust/amend the criteria weightings within the following ranges:

Criteria	Minimum Weighting	Maximum Weighting
Quality and Innovation	10%	70%
Value	10%	70%
Integration, collaboration and service sustainability	10%	70%
Improving access, reducing health inequalities and facilitating choice	10%	70%
Social value	10%	70%

Further Competition Templates

Contracting authorities may use their own locally-available further competition documents, tailored accordingly to reference the framework.

Direct Award

A direct award can be made to a Supplier on the resulting Framework Agreement providing the Participating Authority considers that a direct award was appropriate in the circumstances and can demonstrate the selected Supplier offers the most economically advantageous supply.

If direct awarding the contract, submit for publication on the UK e-notification service a notice of the award - this notice must include the information set out in Schedule 2 of the PSR 2023 and within 30 days of the contract being awarded.

7 NHS Workforce Alliance Support

8 Terms and Conditions

The NHS Terms and Conditions for the Provision of Services (August 2022) and associated call off terms apply to this framework.

TUPE

Where TUPE is applicable to the contract, the contracting authorities should request from the incumbent supplier a list of employees who would be eligible for TUPE which should be provided as part of the further competition process.

GDPR

Where the supplier is involved in the processing of personal data under or in connection with this contract, the parties shall complete the data protection protocol.

9 Management of the Framework Agreement

All framework suppliers have signed framework contracts with NHS Workforce Alliance. NHS Workforce Alliance is responsible for the management of the framework contract.

Suppliers are contracted to provide management information to NHS Workforce Alliance in an agreed format that contains the total value of spend that is placed under the framework. Any questions regarding the framework should be raised with the framework manager.
